WELCOME TO THE THIRD ANNUAL FOLK DANCE CAMP

In behalf of the College of the Pacific and of the Folk Dance Federation of California, we bid you welcome to the Third Annual Folk Dance Camp. We expect you to have an especially fine time. Work and play hard but save time for new friendships. Some of the most friendly and most interesting people in the world are your fellow campers. Let's get acquainted - and fast. Wear your identification card at all times. We come from at least nineteen states to comprise the largest training program of its kind in the nation. Let us all strive to make it one of the best.

On the following pages, we present the schedule of dance instruction in an effort to give you the fullest latitude in the selection of what you want to learn. A few suggestions will help us all.

1. **BEGINNERS** (those who are actually just starting folk and square dancing) follow items marked "B" and you will learn more and have a finer experience. Beginners classes are for Beginners, not advanced dancers trying to learn methods of teaching.
2. You may switch sections from day to day - selecting the dances you particularly desire to learn. However, on "Review Sections", please return to the same section. The purpose of the review section is just that - "review", and all instructors are warned to teach accordingly. Do not go into a review section expecting to learn a new dance. In Square Dances and Square Dancers Callers classes, do not change groups after the second session. You may drop a group but do not enter a new one in these fields without the permission of Mrs. Vera Holleuffer.
3. Laundry and cleaners agency at Student Union. Three day service.
4. **REPETITION OF CLASSES** Certain classes are being scheduled twice. The content will be the same in both on any given day and with the same instructors. This is not intended as a review section, but to give more people a chance to learn these particular dances.
5. **YOU CAN'T TAKE EVERYTHING - CHOOSE WHAT YOU NEED MOST - DIVIDE YOUR DELEGATION FOR MORE COMPLETE COVERAGE!**
6. **THE EXHIBITS** - Agencies, sales rooms, etc. for your enrichment are open each afternoon. These exhibits have been collected at considerable expense and effort, and merit your close investigation. Don't "cut" classes for them, however.

7. SWIMS are schedules each afternoon and three special swims after the parties at no additional costs. Sign the register at the locker room when you go swimming.
8. LARGER Lawn Parties this year because of day-light saving time. Why not "doll up" a bit?
9. CLOTHING - regulations for campus wear preclude the use of swim suits, shorts, halters, etc., in classes, dining hall or on grounds. We will be expected to follow this ruling. Also, smoking is limited to living quarters, the soda fountain, etc., and not in classrooms nor on the grounds.
10. HOUSING assignments are made with the utmost desire to give the utmost satisfaction to the utmost number of people, the utmost amount of time. We have attempted to give you what you asked for. Anyway, the stranger in your room is just another folk-dance pal you haven't met before. Let's keep our assignments and make the most of it. Also, you won't have much time to be in your room. Rooms were assigned in the order of the request.
11. WORKSHOP sections have been arranged for several special groups, more are possible. Talk to Lawton about your pet idea.
12. SWAP-PERIODS - a new idea to better meet more teachers and learn more dances. Tell Lawton about your contributions or those of someone else.
13. EXTRA PACKETS - We have a few packets of the instructions for all three Camps on hand. '48 and '49 are available at \$1.00 each, '50 at \$1.25. First come - first served!
14. CAMP CHURCH SERVICE - In the Chapel, Sunday morning at 9:30, Dr. Melvin Wheatley will again be our speaker.

15. FOLK DANCE MOVIES will be shown at 11 A.M. Sunday, Sears Hall. They are essentially the same as those shown last year. The library will be open at the same hour. No other classes will be scheduled during the A.M. except workshops of your own selection.
16. THE ASSEMBLY PROGRAMS are packed full of good materials, some of the best of our Camp experience. You won't want to miss any. Note the new cooler hour this year, 3:30 P.M. and no announcements.
17. MAIL will be left on the desk in the Anderson Y Center.
18. GUESTS cannot be permitted to attend Camp. We learned to our regret that visitors will dance and slow down instruction very noticeably. Your committee requests that no visitors be invited to any session except the closing FESTIVAL - SATURDAY EVENING - AUGUST 5, BAXTER STADIUM - You will save your friends, yourselves and your Camp Committee much embarrassment, if you do not invite guests to any other session.
19. NEXT YEAR'S CAMP - Registration has started for the Fourth Annual Folk Dance Camp. Costs will be practically the same as this year. The faculty is being contacted and some names should be announced, during this camp. A \$5.00 deposit will hold your place and refunds are again possible up to July 1st. Dates will be approximately the same.
